

# E.S. Cornwall Memorial Scholarship

For engineering graduates to gain experience abroad

**The E.S. Cornwall Scholarship enables engineers to gain experience abroad in the electricity industry, and is open to engineering graduates from all Queensland Universities.**

The Scholarship was established in 1956 as a memorial to Edward Satchwell Cornwall, general manager and director of the Southern Electric Authority of Queensland. Throughout his career as a senior executive he remained a very strong advocate of international experience and university training for professional engineers working in the electricity supply industry.

Through establishing this scholarship, recipients have opportunity to obtain special experience abroad in aspects of the electricity supply industry so that the industry in Australia may benefit by the knowledge and experience thus gained by them.

#### **Value**

The scholarship is a living allowance of at least \$3,500 per month, tenable for a period of 9 to 18 months, as determined by the successful applicant's proposed program of work and/or study.
